Rough-skinned Newt *Taricha granulosa*
Fairly common in suitable habitat

Northwestern Salamander *Ambystoma gracile*

Long-toed Salamander *Ambystoma macrodactylum*
Rare

Ensatina Salamander *Ensatina eschscholtzii oregonensis*

Western Red-backed Salamander *Plethodon vehiculum*

Western Toad *Bufo boreas*
Uncommon

Pacific Tree Frog *Hyla regilla*
Common in remaining freshwater wetlands, but declining in area due to habitat loss.

Red-legged Frog *Rana aurora*
Uncommon, eg. Burns Bog

Bullfrog *Rana catesbeiana*
Introduced, common

Green Frog *Rana clamitans melanota*
Introduced, locally common

Oregon Spotted Frog *Rana pretiosa*
Presumed extirpated in area
